I am having a wonderful time getting to know the residents in St. Anthony, Pond View and Chandler Place. I continue to celebrate the love, compassion and support that residents show for each other and the friendliness that is most evident. In the column for this month I would like to look at special days of celebration for faith groups around the world.

The month of September carries special meaning for many faith groups around the world. There are special observances in September for those in the, Islamic faith, Jewish faith, and, Christian faith

Islam observes Ramadan during August and September. Ramadan is a special month of the year for over one billion Muslims throughout the world. It is a time for inner reflection, devotion to God, and self-control. Muslims think of it as a kind of tune-up for their spiritual lives. During Ramadan the Islamic community observes fasting from sunrise to sunset as part of their spiritual practice. Eid al-Fitr, the end of Ramadan, takes place this year between September 9 and September 11 and is marked with festivities, exchanging of gifts and feasting.

The Jewish community observes Yom Kippur. Yom Kippur is considered one of the most important observances of the Jewish year. Yom Kippur means Day of Atonement and is first described in Leviticus 23: 26 and following. On this day there are actions and rituals that atone (pay for) the sins committed against God and payment is declared complete for the year. This year Yom Kippur is observed from Friday, September 17 through sundown on Saturday, September 18.

The Christian Church observes the Feast of the Holy Cross on September 14. The Feast of the Holy Cross has been observed in the Christian Church since the reign of Constantine and was first observed in 335 A.D. Helena, the mother of Constantine, began to search in the Holy Lands for special holy sights connected with the life of Christ. At these sites, Helena built churches. On September 14, 335 A.D. the Church dedicated the Church of the Holy Sepulchre which was built on the site of the crucifixion. September 14 has since become a day for recognizing the Cross (in a festal atmosphere that would be inappropriate on Good Friday) as a symbol of triumph, as a sign of Christ's victory over death, and a reminder of His promise, "And when I am lifted up, I will draw all people unto me." (John 12:32)
